


1. • COPERNICUS (1473-1543): GERMANY ★ 5 MARK 1973J SILVER!

Interesting commemorative issue in silver dedicated to the 500th anniversary of birthday of Nicolaus Copernicus, who developed mathematical heliocentric model of the world in attractive condition. The coin depicts all known those days planets, but the Sun took the central place in the model, being planets orbiting around it. The Moon is depicted orbiting around the Earth, Due to Aristotle influence the model still had planets orbiting on ideal circles. This influence was overcome half a century later, when new mathematics was developed. Copernicus' motto "IN MEDIO OMNIUM RESIDET SOL" (In center of everything the Sun enthroned) is given in Latin on the edge.

. After the discovery of moons orbiting Jupiter, made by Galileo, the question of how to name them arose. Galileo himself gave names of Medici's, who supported him. Later it was decided to find the names in ancient mythology. Due to the myth Zeus abducted Europa from Africa coast. As the result, Europa became a moon of Jupiter, being both depicted on the coin as a beautiful young woman on a back of the Bull (transformation of Zeus). The idea, the view and whole scene is a replica from ancient silver issue struck at Cyprus more than 2000 years ago. Though the name of the king of Marion in Cypriot syllabic writing is repeated, the coin was struck under democracy rule.


